



Melody Carlson's new Christmas book, *The Christmas Angel Project*, is perfect for readers who want a heartwarming and hopeful Christmas story. It follows five women from different walks of life who have become close friends through their book club. When the leader of the book club unexpectedly passes away, the four remaining friends are stunned. She was the glue that held them together, and they're sure that without her the group can't continue. When the group gathers "one last time" to open a bag Abby's husband gives them, they find Abby had made each of them an angel ornament for Christmas, crafted especially for each woman and accompanied by a sweet and personal note. Inspired by their beloved friend, the remaining members decide to commit themselves to becoming Christmas Angels to others in need. Each woman will use her life situation and talents to reach out and help others in her own unique way--little knowing that her own life and her relationships will be changed forever.

A new audio book recently added to the Library's collection is *You and Me Forever: Marriage in Light of Eternity* by Francis & Lisa Chan. Marriage is great, but it's not forever. It's until death do us part. Then come eternal rewards or regrets depending on how we spent our lives.
