It will also be possible for Shar-A-Thon participants to arrange to have their monthly payment check sent automatically. Those taking part in Shar-A-Thon will have the option to choose their method of payment.

said station manger, Burl Updyke. The new method of payment is for listeners' convenience, he said, as he emphasized the need for all listeners to give to keep WRGN strong in 2011.

PRAISE: WIVH's new location has improved the outreach of the station, much to listeners delight in the West Indies. God be praised.




